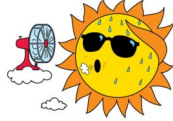

From the Mayor

Summer has come on strong. The heat and humidity have been brutal, and the periods of heavy rains and strong winds we've experienced wreaked havoc on outdoor furniture and gardens all over town.



Have you seen Milton's hanging flower baskets and flower pots? They are absolutely beautiful. The rain and wind in mid-May threatened to remove all the flowers from these plants, but they came back around after a few days. Beth Williamson of the Halfway Market supplied our flowers this year, and they are stunning. Thank you, Beth!



We have a few newer businesses that have opened up or will open in town soon, including Big Sarge's Custom Embroidery of Milton, Trulieve, I Smoke 2, and La Tapatia Tienda. I wish these businesses the best of luck and encourage all of you to welcome them to Milton.

I would also like to commend our field employees for their hard work, even with temperatures nearing 100 degrees. This dangerously hot weather increases the potential for heat-related illnesses, especially for those working outside or participating in outdoor activities. Please be careful and take preventative measures to protect yourself from heat stroke.

As you may have heard, the Cabell County Board of Education has purchased land out Newman's Branch on which to build the new elementary school. Although plans have not been finalized, I'm sure that the Board of Education will build an excellent facility for our children. We will keep you updated as we learn more.

Several streets have been paved since last newsletter. As every household knows, the price of everything is going up, including concrete and blacktop, but we are still trying to pave and patch as many roads as we can.



The Sewer Project is finally getting underway. I'm sure this project will create some aggravation and disruptions in traffic flow, but these inconveniences will be short-lived and well-worth it. Sewer back-ups are no laughing matter, and I hope we can get this project finished before we see any major sewage problems.

The water line replacement project on Heck street is completed. We are still in the process of obtaining easements so that we can move forward with the Newman's Branch water line project. After all the easements are acquired, this project will go out for bid, and construction should begin a few months later.

We also applied for a grant from the Cabell County Commission to help update our water plant. We were recently advised that the Commission approved a \$1 million grant for this purpose! Thank you, Commissioners!



If you have driven by Jarrell Sargent Park, I'm sure you've noticed that we had the basketball court resurfaced, and widened Lawhorn Street a bit. In addition, we have applied for a Land and Water Conservation Fund grant to enhance Jarrell Sargent Park.

From the Director of Public Works Charles Conard

We are taking advantage of the warmer weather and getting as many projects done as possible. We recently cleaned out around the sign near Wendy's. It looks much cleaner and brighter, and I thank our employees for their hard work removing layers upon layers of landscape fabric, mulch and rocks.



A large portion of each week is spent cutting grass and weed eating. Many residents are also spending more time outdoors working in their yards. I want to remind the residents in the City limits that we will pick up your yard waste free of charge; however, you must cut the tree

and brush trimmings into manageable-sized pieces—branches no more than three feet long, nor larger than three inches in diameter. Grass clippings and smaller yard waste items must be bagged and weigh less than thirty pounds. Just set them by the curb and we will pick them up when possible. If we haven't picked them up within a couple of days, simply call City Hall and let us know. No trash, please.



As the mayor pointed out in his article, the water line project on Heck Street is finished and the long-anticipated sewer project has begun. We are also inching closer to construction on the water line replacement project on Newman's Branch, which was funded fully for the amount originally estimated. Prices have increased, of course, and we are doing our best to obtain as much grant funding as possible.

Spring cleanup went well, but we continue to have people bringing in trash from outside City limits. This service is provided to residents within the City of Milton, and not intended for the collection of waste from those outside City limits. Please don't be the reason this service is discontinued.

More street paving projects are currently being done, with more on the horizon. Our goal is to pave every roadway in Milton City Limits, and slowly but surely, we are making it happen.



Due to increasing fuel, labor and equipment costs, Mountain State Waste will be adding a fuel surcharge to their monthly fees beginning July 20, 2022. The fuel surcharge will be reviewed and adjusted periodically and will follow the recommended fuel surcharge published by the West Virginia Public Service Commission. The current fuel surcharge approved by the WV PSC is 9.62%.



Grilling Safety

There's nothing like outdoor grilling. It's one of the most popular ways to cook food. But, a grill placed too close to anything that can burn is a fire hazard. They can be very hot, causing burn injuries. Follow these simple tips and you will be on the way to safe grilling.

SAFETY TIPS

- Propane and charcoal BBQ grills should only be used outdoors.
- The grill should be placed well away from the home, deck railings and out from under eaves and overhanging branches.
- Keep children and pets at least three feet away from the grill area.
- Keep your grill clean by removing grease or fat buildup from the grills and in trays below the grill.
- Never leave your grill unattended.
- Always make sure your gas grill lid is open before lighting it.

CHARCOAL GRILLS

- There are several ways to get the charcoal ready to use. Charcoal chimney starters allow you to start the charcoal using newspaper as a fuel.
- If you use a starter fluid, use only charcoal starter fluid. Never add charcoal fluid or any other flammable liquids to the fire.
- Keep charcoal fluid out of the reach of children and away from heat sources.
- There are also electric charcoal starters, which do not use fire. Be sure to use an extension cord for outdoor use.
- When you are finished grilling, let the coals completely cool before disposing in a metal container.


PROpane Grills

Check the gas tank hose for leaks before using it for the first time each year. Apply a light soap and water solution to the hose. A propane leak will release bubbles. If your grill has a gas leak, by smell or the soapy bubble test, and there is no flame, turn off both the gas tank and the grill. If the leak stops, get the grill serviced by a professional before using it again. If the leak does not stop, call the fire department. **If you smell gas while cooking, immediately get away from the grill and call the fire department. Do not move the grill.**

If the flame goes out, turn the grill and gas off and wait at least 5 minutes before re-lighting it.

FACTS


- July is the peak month for grill fires.
- Roughly half of the injuries involving grills are thermal burns.

For the past year, the Cooney Ricketts Chapter of the United Daughters of the Confederacy has been collecting money to pay for a State Roadside Historical Marker for the birthplace of our namesake, Cooney Ricketts. Our program this month was presented by Michael Lacy, a retired college professor from Grayson, Kentucky who specializes in Confederate history. His talk on the Confederate Chaplains was very interesting and we look forward to having him again as a guest speaker.

We submitted membership papers for Mary Johnson. That makes two new potential members for our chapter this year. And as of July 9, the Cooney Ricketts Chapter will be four-years-old. It has been a very rewarding 4 years and the Chapter looks forward to many more.

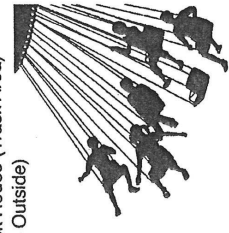

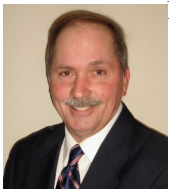

If this 50/50 grant is awarded we will create a picnic shelter with bathroom facilities, as well as add more play equipment for children. This will offer more options for families looking for a fun, safe place to take their children and hold small events. We should hear soon if we've been awarded this grant.

This year, the City will not be putting on a fireworks display. However, we will be hosting an Independence Day Celebration at April Dawn Park on Saturday, July 2, 2022 from Noon to 3pm. It has been way too long since the City has hosted an event, and we are excited to resume this tradition. We will have inflatables, balloon twisting, games, activities and raffles, as well as free hot dogs, watermelon, Snow Cones, cake and drinks.

We are fortunate to live in a City whose local businesses care so much about the residents of this wonderful City.
