Mayor Canterbury called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The invocation was given by Council Member Adkins and the pledge of allegiance was said in unison. Those present were Mayor Tom Canterbury, Recorder Dana Walters, Council Members Tennis Adkins, Bob Legg, Carl Harshbarger, Dakota Miller, and Troy Nicely.

Mayor Canterbury asked everyone to keep Carl Harshbarger in their prayers as his father passed away. He also asked that we keep Paul Linville in our prayers as his mother passed away.

Council Member Harshbarger moved to approve the agenda. Second by Council Member Legg. Motion carried.

Recorder Walters read the minutes from the August 3 Public Hearing and the August 3 Regular Meeting. Council Member Adkins moved to approve the minutes. Second by Council Member Legg. Motion carried.

Recorder Walters presented the City bills for July 2021 totaling \$164,120.58 for the General Fund and \$26,954.89 for the Cemetery Fund. Council Member Miller questioned a bill from Tyler Technologies. Council Member Adkins moved to approve the bills. Second by Council Member Legg. Motion carried.

Recorder Walters read the City Financial Report for July 2021. General Fund Total: \$1,188,723.18; Cemetery Total: \$67,922.94; Coal Severance Total: \$10,843.31; American Rescue Plan Act Total: \$558,951.10. Council Member Harshbarger moved to approve the Financial Reports. Second by Council Member Miller. Motion carried.

Chief Parsons read the Police Report for July 2021. Chief Parsons advised that the cruiser he had ordered has been shipped and is in transit. Council Member Adkins moved to approve the report for July. Second by Council Member Miller. Motion carried.

Council Member Miller made a motion to bring the Third Reading of the Proposed Sewer Bond Ordinance back to the table. Second by Council Member Legg. Motion carried.

Mayor Canterbury gave the Third and Final Reading of the proposed Sewer Bond Ordinance. Council Member Nicely moved to approve the Third Reading of the proposed Sewer Bond Ordinance. Second by Council Member Harshbarger. Motion carried.

Mayor Canterbury gave the Second Reading of an Ordinance Amending, Modifying and Reenacting Article 1715 Contractor Mechanical Licensing. Council Member Miller moved to approve the Second Reading. Second by Council Member Legg. Motion carried.

Mayor Canterbury read a Resolution of Council to Withdraw \$122,785.75 from MMUC's Putnam County Bank CD, and Transfer that Sum to Its Ohio Valley Bank Consolidated Checking Account. Council Member Adkins moved to approve the Resolution. Second by Council Member Miller. Motion carried.

Council Member Harshbarger gave a Housing Authority report.

Mayor Canterbury advised that the City's Anniversary Celebration set for September 18, 2021 has been cancelled, but the fireworks will still go on as planned that evening around 9 pm.

Mayor Canterbury commended Delegate Daniel Linville who arranged a meeting between the City, the IJDC and the Water Development Authority to discuss critical needs. With his assistance, the City was granted \$970,000 to replace water lines on Newman's Branch.

Delegate Linville commented that he was happy to be able to help the City and Milton residents, and that he would continue to do all he could to assist.

Council Member Harshbarger moved to adjourn at 7:36 pm. Second by Council Member Adkins. Motion carried.
