From the Mayor

As we near Labor Day, many are soaking in the last weeks of summer sun, while others are looking forward to autumn's pumpkin-spice everything. A new school year recently began and I can't help but wonder where the kids' summer break went? Whether you are Team Summer or Team Fall, I'm sure you'll agree that the year is flying by.

You've probably noticed that the sewer project is underway. It should be completed by this time next year. Funding for this project was made possible by loans and grants received from the USDA Rural Development office. As you know, the prices of equipment and materials have skyrocketed since the cost of this job was initially estimated, creating a large funding shortfall when bids were received for this job. Without the hard work and dedication of the folks at the USDA Rural Development office, I'm not sure how this project would have gone forward, so I'd like to thank them for making sure we were able to proceed as designed.

We have several other utility projects in the works. Easement acquisitions are underway, and our engineering firm has been working with the IJDC and Region 2 Planning & Development Council to secure funding to replace water lines along Newman's Branch. This project has already faced some of the same problems as the sewer project. Between the time a cost estimate is prepared for a project and the time it is ready for bids, the construction and material costs have substantially risen. This issue is being faced by cities all over the country, and they don't anticipate it will improve any time soon.

Our Independence Day Celebration held on July 2nd was the first community event the City has hosted in two and a half years. It was a lot of fun, and I am so thankful that we are finally able to get back to hosting these festivals. I'd like to say a hearty "THANK YOU!" to the churches, organizations and businesses in Milton that contributed to the success of this event.

Our next event will be Halloween in the Park on October 31st from 6-8pm at April Dawn Park. As in the past, we will have costume contests for different age groups, free corndogs and drinks and other activities. Trunk-or-Treat will take place by April Dawn Park along Smith Street. We hope to see you there!

US Army Corps of Engineers

The US Army Corps of Engineers will be having informational meetings about the Milton Flood Wall at Milton City Hall on September 27 and 28, 2022 from 3pm-7pm. USACE representatives will be available during these meetings to discuss the project, answer questions, and listen to any concerns you might have. We hope you will come out on one or both of those days to speak to the Corps.

From the Director of Public Works Charles Conard

At long last the Sewer Project has gotten to the construction stage. This project, which has been in the works for several years, has hit quite a few snags along the way, including the most recent issues of bid over-runs and difficulty obtaining materials. I'm excited to see this job begin, but look forward to its completion.



Excavation for this project will disturb various City roads as well as some driveways (for which easements have been obtained from the property owner.) Please remember that these areas will be patched temporarily, but may not be fully repaired until the

weather is suitable and there is sufficient paving to be done. Additionally, there are roads that need to be repaired, but because those roads will soon be disturbed by either the sewer project or flood wall construction, it makes no sense to waste money to pave a road that will have to be repaved again after the projects are finished.

We recently received a grant from the Cabell County Commission to help upgrade the filtration system at the water plant. This project is in its early stages, and we will keep you updated on developments. We discuss all utility projects at the Utility Board meetings held the first Tuesday of each month at 5:30pm. If you have questions, or want to hear progress updates, please come to those meetings.

The City-wide fall clean-up has been scheduled for the week of September 19-22. Remember, no car parts, batteries, tires. appliances, electronics or yard wastes, and only one truckload per residence. We will follow a slightly modified schedule from the last few clean-ups; we will only be picking up Monday thru Thursday. Be sure to check out the attached map to see when pick-up will be in your area.

The City of Milton is pleased that we can regularly pick up grass clippings and brush for its residents. However, we are



still having issues with bags of yard waste that are too heavy to pick up and get into the truck. Please make sure the bags of yard waste weigh no more than 30 pounds. You can either use smaller bags, or split the yard waste into more bags. We cannot risk an employee being hurt; so if the bags

are too heavy, they will remain where you've placed them.

I also want to remind everyone that water meters must be accessible to Milton Utilities employees at all times for maintenance or meter reading. Please limit landscaping around your water meter box, trim trees and bushes, and refrain from planting anything, including flowers, around meters. Likewise, do not cover the water meter lid with mulch, gravel, yard waste or any other item. A water meter lid may not be the most appealing part of your lawn, but we must be able to find and access it.

Finally, we will be flushing fire hydrants the week of October 3-7, 2022. We will send out calls advising when hydrants will be flushed in your area. Keep in mind that we can't notify you of an emergency or a scheduled event if we do not have an updated telephone number. If you haven't received at least one automated call from the utilities department in the six months, that's a pretty good sign that your telephone number has not been updated. Please call 304-743-3422 to make sure we have your correct contact information. It is more important than you might think.

Do You Qualify?

SCAC Weatherization Program, office located at 1595 US Rt. 60 East, Milton, WV helps individuals with some weatherization issues if you qualify (NOT REPAIRS). For more info visit their website www.acacwv.org.

USDA (304-284-4861) also offers assistance through the 504 Program, a low interest loan for those 62 or older who own their home and the 502 Program, a 100% financed, no interest loan for lowincome homeowners.


We are working on getting events set back up later this year such as live music, gun shows, etc. Keep an eye on our Facebook page and the city calendar for upcoming info.

From the Utilities Department

Hello and happy Fall from the Utilities Department! As most of you know, the Sewer Project is well underway. Crews have been working on Main Street near the Post Office and on South Main Street. Crews will continue working over the coming months in various locations around town. For residents whose driveway is affected by the digging, we are told that your driveway will be repaired, although not right away, to its former condition. The sewer rate increase became effective with the commencement of the Sewer Project and was reflected on the bills that went out in August.

We have implemented a new system to contact you by phone for reasons such as payment reminders, notification of water outages, boil water advisories, etc. The telephone number the calls will come from is 681-203-5645. If you miss a call from this number, you may dial it back and the message can be replayed. You may want to save this telephone number so you recognize the Water Office attempting to get in touch with you. Also, please be sure the information we have on file for you is correct and up to date so you can be reached in case of emergency.

As we all say goodbye to another Summer, we welcome the change of leaves and cooler air temperatures that come along with the Fall. But before the weather grows too much colder, it's important to prepare for the winter months to prevent costly damage. Below are the fall preventative home maintenance steps that every homeowner should follow.

FALL PREVENTATIVE HOME MAINTENANCE TIPS

Gutters and Downspouts

- Clean gutters and downspouts frequently throughout fall to prevent buildup of leaves and other debris. Neglected gutters can lead to wood rot problems and pest infestations, not to mention ruined gutters.
- Be sure water is not coming down behind gutters and that all support brackets are securely in place.
- Ensure that water drains properly and does not pool. Pooling can cause damage to foundations, driveways, and walkways.

Windows and Doors

- Change summer screens to cool weather storm windows and doors.
- Inspect and repair any loose or damaged window or door frames.
- Install weather stripping or caulking around windows and doors to prevent drafts and to lower heating bills.

Heating Systems

- Replace the filter in your furnace.
- Consider having a heating professional check your heating system to ensure optimal performance and discover minor problems before they turn into costly major repairs.
- Clean your ducts to better your heating system's efficiency as well as to reduce household dust and to provide relief to those with respiratory problems.

Plumbing

- To prevent pipes freezing and bursting, ensure that the pipes are well insulated.
- Know how to locate and turn off the water shut-off valve in case pipes do freeze.

Chimney and Fireplace

- Call a professional in to inspect and clean your chimney. Fireplaces that are regularly used during the season should have an annual cleaning to prevent dangerous chimney fires.
- Test your fireplace flue for a tight seal when closed.

Attic ventilation

- Be sure attic insulation doesn't cover vents in the eaves to prevent winter ice dams on the roof.
- Be sure ridge vents and vents at eaves are free of plants and debris.
- Check bird and rodent screens for attic vents to prevent any unwanted guests.

Landscape and Yardwork

- Although grass appears to stop growing in the fall, the roots are actually growing deeper to prepare for winter. Now is the
 best time to fertilize and reseed your lawn.
- Prune your trees and shrubs after the leaves turn to encourage healthy growth.
- Trim any tree limbs that are dangerously close to power lines or the roof of your house. Heavy snow and ice can cause damage in the winter.

As always make sure the person or company doing the work is Licensed with the City and pulls the proper permits.




