

CITY OF MILTON

COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

AUGUST 3, 2021

7:00 P.M.

Mayor Canterbury called the meeting to order at 8:18 p.m. The invocation was given by Council Member Adkins and the pledge of allegiance was said in unison. Those present were Mayor Tom Canterbury, Recorder Dana Walters, Council Members Tennis Adkins, Carl Harshbarger, Dakota Miller, and Troy Nicely. Council Member Bob Legg was absent.

Mayor Canterbury asked everyone to keep Bob Legg in their prayers as he has undergone a surgery. He also asked everyone to keep Dana Walters and her family in prayer because her Mother-in-Law and Brother -in-law are hospitalized with Covid, and her Sister-in-Law passed away from Covid.

Council Member Harshbarger moved to approve the agenda. Second by Council Member Miller. Motion carried.

Mayor Canterbury gave the Third Reading of the proposed Sewer Bond Ordinance. Council Member Nicely moved to table the Third Reading until the next meeting. Mr. Stump advised that we are still 30-60 days from being ready to go forward, so tabling this issue until next month was not a problem. Second Council Member Harshbarger. Motion carried.

Recorder Walters read the minutes from the July 6 regular meeting and the July 30 Work Session. Council Member Adkins moved to approve the minutes. Second by Council Member Miller. Motion carried.

Recorder Walters presented the City bills for June 2021 totaling \$234,276.40 for the General Fund. Council Member Miller moved to approve the bills. Second by Council Member Adkins. Motion carried.

Recorder Walters read the City Financial Report for June 2021. General Fund Total: \$1,143,506.52; Cemetery Total: \$93,177.83; Coal Severance Total: \$9,464.54. Council Member Harshbarger moved to approve the Financial Reports. Second by Council Member Miller. Motion carried.

Recorder Walters read the City Financial Report for the end of fiscal year 2021, with the same totals as above. Council Member Harshbarger moved to approve the Financial Reports. Second by Council Member Miller. Motion carried.

Patrolman Lloyd read the Police Report for June 2021. Council Member Adkins moved to approve the report for June. Second by Council Member Miller. Motion carried.

Mayor Canterbury read a Sewer Project Draw Resolution (Draw 23) for the Payment of Invoices from the Account Titled 2018 Sewer Project. Council Member Adkins moved to approve the resolution. Second by Council Member Miller. Motion carried.

Mayor Canterbury gave the Second Reading of an Ordinance Amending, Modifying and Reenacting Article 705.01 (a) Definitions and Article 705.16 Fees of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Milton to Correspond with Changes to State Law Regarding Contractors. Council Member Miller moved to approve the Second Reading. Second by Council Member Harshbarger. Motion carried.

Mayor Canterbury gave the First Reading of an Ordinance Amending, Modifying and Reenacting Article 1715 Contractor Mechanical Licensing. Council Member Miller moved to approve the First Reading. Second by Council Member Adkins. Motion carried.

Mayor Canterbury read a Resolution of Council Authorizing the Transfer of Funds Totaling \$7,300.00 from the General Savings Account to the General Checking Account to Pay Akers Paving for paving around City Hall. Council Member Adkins moved to approve the Resolution. Second by Council Member Miller. Motion carried.

Mayor Canterbury read a Resolution of Council to Adopt Revisions to the City of Milton's Employee Handbook. Council Member Harshbarger moved to adopt the revisions. Second by Council Member Nicely. Motion carried.

Council Member Harshbarger stated that Tina Ray is planning a 5K run for Breast Cancer Awareness and requested authorization for someone to help her put down and remove cones that day. Mayor Canterbury stated that would not be a problem.

Gary Cooper presented Council with a proposed parade route for the October 3rd Pumpkin Festival Parade.

Ernie Anderson stated that the street signs where he lives are not in the proper places, which caused confusion when emergency services tried to find his home. He also stated that the empty house on South Main by Becky's Beauty Box is in terrible shape and unlivable and the weeds have gotten out of hand. Mayor Canterbury stated that the City is working on this matter, and something will be done as soon as legally possible.

Karen Cremeans stated that she spoke to Brian Lowe with the Corps of Engineers who indicated that Robert Bond planned to schedule meetings at City Hall; she inquired if he had set anything up, to which she was told not yet.

Council Member Harshbarger moved to adjourn at 8:55 p.m. Second by Council Member Miller. Motion carried.
